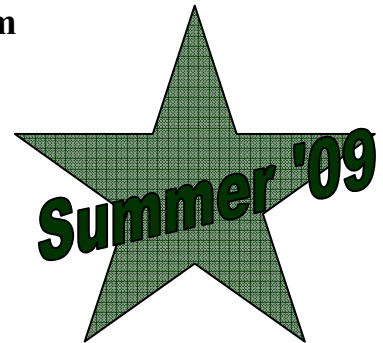

Important Information

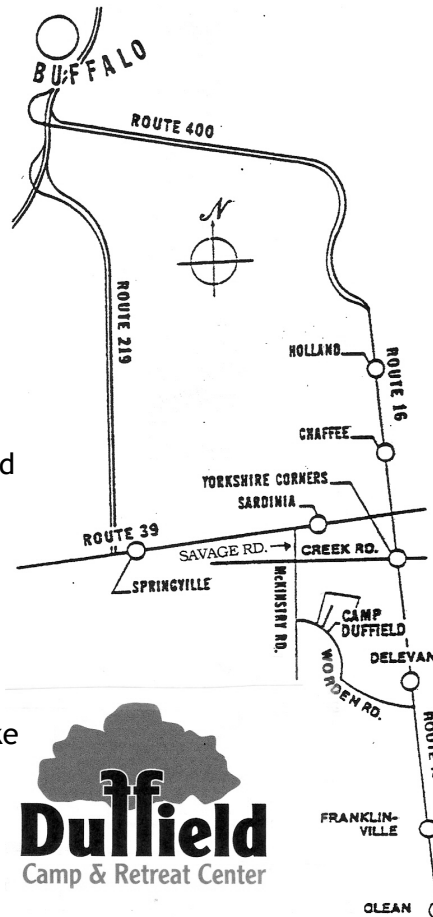
Where is Camp Duffield located?

Camp Duffield is situated in the rolling hills of Cattaraugus County, near the town of Delevan, only an hour's drive South of Buffalo.

Directions to Duffield

From the South: North on Rt. 16 and turn left on Worden Road. Go 2 miles; camp is on the right.

From the North: South on Rt. 400, continue when it ends on Rt. 16 to Yorkshire Corners and turn right on Creek Road at the Burger King. Make a left onto McKinstry Road; make a left onto Worden Road; the camp is on the left.



Accommodations at Camp Duffield

Keeler:

A spacious A-frame lodge with fireplace, home-style kitchen, beds for 25, and shower facilities.

Cabins:

There are 6 cabins that each provide bunkhouse style sleeping for 12 persons, with modern bathroom and shower facilities.

Outpost:

Tents on platforms gathered around a campfire and picnic pavilion, also with modern bathroom and shower facilities.
